

## Listed Buildings in Ashleworth

The following is taken from <https://britishlistedbuildings.co.uk/>. The list of Ashleworth listed buildings is on pages 2 and 3.

A Locally Listed Building is a building, structure or feature considered by the Borough Council as having local historic and architectural value, but that are not included on a statutory list (recognised by the Government as nationally important). Buildings or structures that make a special contribution to the history, appearance, character, and cultural value of Tewkesbury, perhaps by association with a famous person or event, will be considered. Qualities of age, style and detailing will be of interest as will historic structures such as walls or railings, and historic street furniture including post boxes, bollards, and street lighting. It is likely that most of the entries will date from the mid-19<sup>th</sup> to the 20<sup>th</sup> century as earlier buildings and structures of merit will have been included in the statutory lists.

The principle purpose of the list is to ensure that the special local and community significance of these assets will be recognised and particular care taken over decisions affecting their future. Whilst the state of repair of a building or structure is not a relevant consideration when considering inclusion on the Local List, the extent to which the building retains its historic form will be. Buildings and structures of historical or architectural interest are irreplaceable assets that add to the quality of the local environment by contributing to our understanding of both the present and past and enhancing local distinctiveness. The inclusion of buildings of architectural quality and character or historical significance on the local list is based upon their ability to satisfy one or more of the following criteria:

- **Architectural Interest.** To be of special architectural interest a building must be of importance in its architectural design, detailing or craftsmanship or be of a distinctive building type or a significant plan form. Early or substantially intact examples of buildings or structures or those displaying technological innovation will be considered.
- **Historic Interest.** To be of special historic interest a building must illustrate important aspects of the region's social, economic, cultural, or military history and/or have close historical associations with locally important people.
